Welcome to the 64th Bowl Down Cancer Tournament, a fundraiser by the Oregon State Bowling Proprietors Association.

Thank you for participating in this event that means so much to us.

This year we have a goal to triple past participation numbers.

Edit for your center: Two ways to participate: (Your center decides one or both) During league pay \$10 prior to league starting. You may enter every week you bowl league through the month of April. Or host squad times Charging the \$10 plus your lineage.

Your donation dollars are going to The Cancer Research Institute.

Their Mission: Save more lives by fueling the discovery and development of powerful immunotherapies for all types of cancer. Their company is rated 96 out of 100 on the charity rating scale. They have matched our donations every year for the last 5 years, not including the 2020. We have a combined donation of over \$27,000.

We will be bowling 3 games with handicap today. Please verify your entering average on your recap. Averages submitted are the highest league average as of March 31st. Failure to use correct average at the State finals may disqualify scores if submitted average is lower than correct average. Sport and Challenge Averages must be noted and using the USBC Conversions chart will determine the entering averages.

Results will be posted on the OSBPA.com website. First place in each division will get a guaranteed \$300. Youth division will be on a sliding scale based on entries. Prizes will be paid at 1 for every 8 ratio and you may only cash once. Your checks will be mailed to your home bowling center by May 28th at the latest. You may Reenter once a week per league bowled or if squads, up to 4 extra times (if space allows).

Optional: We will have a 50/50 drawing each squad with a ticket drawn before the completion of the 3rd game, 50% to our charity and 50% to the lucky ticket holder.

We will begin with 10 minutes of practice and once arrows are up you may begin.
